

LOGISTIC PROGRESSION

Choreography & Performance: Hayley Bone & Emily Napier Post-Doc Research Scientist: Gavia Gray Music: "Between the Buttons" by French 79, "Serenity" by Popof

Logistic Progression is an exploration of gendered movement using machine learning techniques. This work embraces interdisciplinary possibilities, investigates the relationship between movement and gender, and pursues expression beyond binaries.

Part 1: Motion Interpolation - Choreography is prompted and reimagined through motion interpolations. Automatic differentiation is used to optimize the interpolation, where spectral features are used as target statistics.

Part 2: Conditional Generation - Human motion data was converted to text to train a language model architecture. Motions are generated with prompts such as partial movements containing select joints, or conditioning tokens describing the dancer and situation as a high dimensional embedding. Logistic Progression uses machine learning techniques developed by Emily Napier, Gavia Gray, and Sageev Oore with choreography by Hayley Bone.

HACE

This piece was initially created for Breaking Circus' show, That Which Lights Your Way: Refraction, in April 2022. It was created with Lydia Zimmer (choreography) and Samuel Roy (juggling mentorship). The newly adapted version is loosely inspired by High Altitude Cerebral Edema (HACE), a severe condition associated with high altitude sickness. More specifically, the piece attempts to represent varying stages and elements of a "climb" and the eventual downfall of an individual. The lack of air, the intensity of the "climb," and the pressurizing self-doubts and inner thoughts impede on the individual as they juggle their chances at survival.
